Introduction

Wealth Alignment Partners, LLC ("WAP") is an investment adviser registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) headquartered in Hawaii, with offices in Hawaii and Minnesota. Registration does not imply any specific level of skill or training. Brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ and it is important for you to understand the differences. Free and simple tools are available to research firms and financial professionals at Investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about broker-dealers, investment advisers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

WAP provides personalized wealth management, financial planning, and organization advisory services. Clients advised may include individuals, couples, families, high net worth individuals, trusts, foundations, organizations, and corporations. Generally, there is no minimum amount of assets required to be placed with WAP.

Asset Management

Asset management services will generally be provided on a "discretionary" basis. When WAP is engaged to provide asset management services on a discretionary basis, we will monitor your accounts to ensure that they are meeting your asset allocation requirements. If any changes are needed to your investments, we will make the changes. These changes may involve selling a security or group of investments and buying others or keeping the proceeds in cash. You may at any time place restrictions on the types of investments we may use on your behalf, or on the allocations to each security type. In some circumstances, WAP may provide asset management services on a non-discretionary basis. When a client engages us to provide asset management services on a non-discretionary basis, we monitor the accounts in the same way as for discretionary services. However, under a non-discretionary arrangement, WAP will not make changes to the clients' portfolio until and unless WAP receives approval from the client that our proposed changes are acceptable to the client.

Financial Planning

Financial Planning is a process by which a client's current circumstances are reviewed, goals stated, and a plan is made to guide the client to those goals. Once client information is received, we will discuss their financial needs and goals, and compare their current financial situation with the objectives they stated. Once these are compared, we will create a financial and/or investment plan to help meet their objective. Actual implementation is entirely at the discretion of the client which may require professional assistance. Recommendations may be in both generic and specific form. It is very important that our clients continually provide us with any updates so that, if necessary, we are able to update their plan. Otherwise, their plan may no longer be accurate. Financial planning services, depending on the complexities of the plan, may be included with investment advisory services, but in some circumstances can be provided on a standalone basis.

What fees will I pay?

WAP asset management fees range from 0.25% to 1.25% per annum of the fair market value of the portfolio. The fee range stated is a guide. Fees are negotiable, and may be higher or lower than this range, based on the nature of the account. Factors affecting fee percentages include the size of the account, complexity of asset structures, and other factors. Asset management fees will generally be debited directly from each client's account. As of the date of this brochure, the advisory fees may be paid quarterly, in arrears, and the fees shall be calculated quarterly using an average of the daily balance in the client's account throughout the billing period, after taking into account deposits and withdrawals, for purposes of determining the market value of the assets upon which the advisory fee is based.

Financial Planning and Business Advisory services are billed on an hourly basis ranging between \$150 and \$300 per hour plus direct expenses incurred. The total fee is calculated by the number of hours times the hourly rate of the team member providing the service plus direct cost, rounded up to the nearest quarter hour. Planning services may also be provided on a flat fee basis negotiated prior to providing the service. Financial planning and Business Advisory fees, depending on complexity, may be covered by asset management fees or billed separately as directed in the client agreement. Payment is due upon presentation of the plan, or pre-agreed milestones.

There are a number of other fees that can be associated with holding and investing in securities. You will be responsible for fees including transaction fees for the purchase or sale of a mutual fund or Exchange Traded Fund, or fees related for the purchase or sale of a stock. Expenses of a fund will not be included in management fees, as they are deducted from the value of the shares by the mutual fund manager. You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying. What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here is an example to help you understand what this means.

Depending on a client's given circumstances, WAP may recommend that a client rollover retirement plan assets to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) managed by us. As a result of a rollover, we may earn fees on those accounts that were previously out of scope. This presents a conflict of interest, as WAP has a financial incentive to recommend that a client roll over retirement assets into an IRA we will manage.
